
**Dive into Documents:** Navigate, format, and rearrange text.

**Work the Web:** Navigate web pages quickly and efficiently using keyboard commands, manage bookmarks, and perform searches.

**Harness Help:** Learn how to access the abundant resources built into the program. This includes context and program specific keystrokes, further training materials, and a JAWS quick command search.

### **Participants will receive:**

- Comprehensive resources for learning JAWS, ZoomText, and Fusion
- CEUs/ACVREP credits for attending the training
- In-person hands-on interactive training
- The opportunity to learn tasks, then try them with instructors who are on-hand to answer questions
- A conceptual overview of how to perform important tasks that will benefit students in and out of the classroom.
